

9 of a family, 2 others killed as SUV falls into UP canal

Ayodhya/Lucknow: Elev en pilgrims were killed, nine of them from a family, and a 10-year-old girl was reported missing after an SUV ferrying 16 people allegedly sped off a rain-slicked road on Sunday and plunged into the swollen Saryu canal in UP's Gonda.

The accident occurred around 10am off Itiyathok town, en route to the Prithvinath Mahadev temple, reports Arshad Afzal Khan. The victims and the survivors, including the driver, were from Siha village under Motiganj police station.

2 men, minor caught in city for stabbing two youths

New Delhi: Two men and a minor were apprehended for allegedly stabbing two youths from Manipur in northwest Delhi's Model Town. 

New Delhi: A special committee set up by Delhi High Court has identified numerous irregularities in the functioning of the city's sewage treatment plants (STPs).

The committee inspected all 37 STPs across the city from May to July. The assessment focused on verifying whether the sewage flowing into the Yamuna through these STPs underwent proper treatment before discharge, confirming the installation of flow meters and sensors at all STP outlets, and ensuring proper monitoring without unauthorised by meeting a monage they expected.

bypassing, among other aspects. The findings revealed significant shortcomings, including substandard treatment processes, inadequate data calibration, insufficient monitoring, untreated sewage being bypassed and instances of treated sewage getting mixed with untreated waste before being discharged. It also flagged industrial effluent being diverted to STPs meant to cater to domestic sewage and issues with sensors, online monitoring systems and flow meters, which resulted in evi-

dent lags in crucial data.

The report also asserted how treated sewage from some plants was being dumped into untreated drains like Shahdara. "Thus, the money spent on the treatment has literally gone down the drain!"

According to the report dated July 25, "In many STPs, the incoming effluent consists of a large quantity of industrial effluent, which the STP is not designed to deal with. Conversely, CETPs (common effluent treatment plants) are receiving a large quantity of domestic sewage as part of their incoming industrial effluent, which they are not designed to deal with." Hence, the committee recommended proper demarcation of the domestic sewage and the industrial waste to prevent inter-mixing. It added that urgent strict actions were needed by authorities like Delhi Pollution Control Committee against the dumping of industrial effluent or cow dung in domestic sewage.

The report also flagged how

The report also flagged how about 11 STPs adhered to older and less-strict DPCC norms on parameters like biochemical oxygen demand and total suspended solids, etc.

Recommending upgradation, it said that during the process, new online monitors and flow meters be installed at the inlet and outlet so that accurate data of the water quality parameters of the incoming wastewater and the treated effluent can be monitored by both STPs and the public. It also asked DPCC to ensure that all sensors are calibrated annually to ensure the authenticity

of the water quality data.

"This is particularly important since the committee was repeatedly informed that the flow meters and the sensors experience regular breakdowns due to wear and tear and even the presence of industrial effluent in the STP," the committee pointed out.

Earlier in May, the high court decided to set up a panel to investigate if a substantial portion of water was bypassing the newly installed flow meters and sensors in the STPs meant to monitor pollution in the Yamuna.

A special bench of Justices Prathiba M Singh and Manmeet PS Arora pointed out that the "entire purpose of STPs would be defeated if the water/sewage is permitted to bypass the flow meters and the sensors at the outlet". A special committee of govt officials, lawyers and petitioners was set up to inspect all flow meters and STPs.

The court was hearing a suo motu matter on waterlogging in the city and asked the panel to provide a report on whether the entire sewage/waterflowing into the Yamuna through the STPs was being treated before being released into the river.

Expect light rain, no colour-code warning issued by Met dept

New Delhi: Parts of the city experienced light to very light rain on Sunday morning, even as several areas recorded rain from late Saturday night until the early morning hours. India Meteorological Department (IMD) earlier forecast that the city was likely to see light to moderate rain on Monday. However, it later revised this to light to very light rain, and no colour-coded warning was issued.

Meanwhile, no major rain occurred on Sunday, while the day turned humid with a heat index or 'feels like' temperature of 43.9 degrees Celsius at 3 pm. Isolated areas of the city recorded drizzling, with Pragati Maidan recording 0.1mm and Pusa recording 0.5mm of rainfall respectively between 8.30 am and 5.30 pm. The base station at Safdarjung recorded no rain, however, between 8.30 am Saturday and 8.30 am Sunday, it recorded 16.7mm of rainfall.

According to weather analysts, the region would still see instances of high-intensity rain over the week since the monsoon line of the trough will keep oscillating around the region.

IIT-D Sets Ground Rules For Use Of Artificial Intelligence To Ensure Ethical And Effective Integration Into Teaching, Research And Exams

New Delhi: At a time when artificial intelligence is reshaping how we learn, teach and think, IIT Delhi took a leap into the future. Last year, IIT Delhiformed a dedicated committee to explore how generative AI tools could be ethically and effectively integrated into teaching, research and examinations. After months of collecting detailed feedback from both students and faculty, the committee released a comprehensive report covering shortterm goals that revealed some eye-opening trends.

A significant 80% of students reported using generative AI (GenAI) tools, with 81% of them engaging with these technologies several times a week. Around 10% of the respondents have even invested in paid subscriptions, citing the limitations and inaccuracy of free versions as a major concern.

Based on these insights, the institute released a set of guidelines. A cornerstone of these new rules is the mandatory disclosure of any content generated or assisted by GenAI tools for transparency and academic integrity.

"We mandated that all academic programmes include exposure to artificial intelligence and machine learning. Most departments have already incorporated the elements, ensuring that all graduates from IIT Delhi will soon possess strong proficiency in AI. This committee was formed on April 9, 2024, to guide this transition and determine the best approach for integrating AI," said Rangan Banerjee, director of IIT Delhi.

In the long term, the committee was tasked with providing clear guidance on the

nitoring advancements in the field, identifying the necessary training and support infrastructure to ensure the ir effective and equitable use, and recommending a governance structure and AI policies that align with the exis-

ting policy framework. The report states, "While generative AI tools offer potential benefits-such as personalised, real-time feedback and customized learning experiences—they also raise significant concerns. These tools can produce inaccurate or misleading responses, and excessive reliance on them may undermine essential learning outcomes, particularly the development of critical thinking skills. It is imperative for educational institutions to estab lish clear guidelines that educate and sensitise both students and faculty"

The genesis of this initiative reflects the growing recognition that GenAI tools are no longer futuristic concepts but active collaborators in academic life. They offer undeniable benefits-personalised, real-time feedback, efficient writing assistance, and novel ways to visualise and explore complex topics. Yet, their rapid adoption has also brought challenges and concerns that the committee sought to understand firsthand by engaging with the campus community. A survey circulated among

faculty and students revealed a nuanced picture of AI's current role at IIT Delhi, Accor ding to the feedback of 427 student respondents, AI facilitated their learning by simplify ing concepts, creating mind maps, and simulating scenarios to deepen understanding. However, they also identified significant limitations: inaccuracies in AI responses, difficulties with complex or con-



und 77% of faculty members use GenAI tools, with half doing so regularly, reflecting a broad acceptance of AI's utility in academic workflows. Faculty members harness these tools for writing assistance, summarising research literature, preparing instructional materials, and streamlining administrative tasks, thereby

enhancing productivity. However, they also raised serious concerns about intellectual integrity, the impact on students' critical thinking development, and the challenges of fair grading when AI-generated content is involved. The lack of reliable detection tools for AI-autho $red\,work\,further\,complicates$ assessment fairness.

Recognising these complexities, the committee's recommendations offer a balanced framework designed to harness AI's benefits while safeguarding academic values. At the individual level, students, researchers, and faculty are urged to disclose AI use transparently—whether in text, images, or data visualisations-to uphold academic integrity. They must take full responsibility for verifying and fact-checking AI-generated content, ensuring it is original and free from plagiarism. Users are also advised to protect privacy by avoiding the input of sensitive or personally identifiable information into AI tools.

For the institution, the committee recommends regular workshops developed in collaboration with academic units to educate and sensitise both students and faculty on ethical, responsible, and effective AI use. Faculty development programmes should include dedicated modules on tions. Additionally, the institute is encouraged to secure campus-wide licences for premium AI tools, ensuring equitable access and levelling the playing field for all departments and users Specific guidance for aca-

demic units stresses the need to embed AI education into core curricula, including professional ethics and domain-specific GenAI applications. Learning outcomes--both at the programme and course level-should be redesigned to reflect AI's transformative impact, emphasising skills like critical thinking, original analysis and knowledge application beyond AI's reach. A curated

and regularly updated resource compendium on ethical and constructive AI use should be developed to support students and faculty alike.

Acknowledging that outright bans on AI use are impractical, the committee advises that plagiarism policies be revised to explicitly address these tools. These policies should encourage transparency and responsible use, penalise unethical behaviour, such as submitting AI-generated work without meaningful personal input, and reward honest engagement with AI technologies. Faculty members are also urged to review assessment outcomes where AI tools are involved, to refine assignments, identify academic dishonesty and raise awareness of AI's role in education.

Third round of DU's admission race begins with option of seat upgrade

New Delhi: The competition for a seat at Delhi University is far from over. The university has opened the third round of undergraduate admissions for the 2025-26 academic session under its Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS), offering multiple pathways for students to secure or improve their placements.

This phase introduces several key features, including seat upgradation, mid-entry applications, and category-based admissions. Students who secured seats in the first or second rounds can now reorder their course-college preferences in hopes of obtaining a more preferred option. The window for upgradation and preference modification was open from

 $the\,evening\,of\,\,Aug\,2\,and\,closed$ at 4.59 pm on Aug 3.

The results of upgraded seat allocations will be announced on August 5 at 5 pm. Colleges will then begin the approval process, which will continue until 4.59 pm on August 6. Students allotted upgraded seats must complete the fee payment by August 7, 4.59 pm to confirm their admission. The vacancy list for the next round will be published on August8at5pm.

In a welcome move for late applicants, the university has opened a mid-entry window for students who missed earlier rounds. Applications for mid-entry will be accepted from August 8 to 10. This option is particularly helpful for those who were unable to register earlier due to

Another important addition is the activation of category-based applications, allowing eligible candidates to apply under their respective reservation categories. With this phase, DU is working to make its admission process more accessible and inclusive—providing a second chance to late applicants while also refining seat distribution for those already in the system.

Delhi govt launches student clubs to nurture skills beyond books

New Delhi: In a move set to energise classrooms and empower students, Delhi govt will introduce student clubs in 100 govt schools starting from the 2025–26 academic session. These clubs aim to give students new platforms for expression, exploration, and all-round development—going far beyond textbooks and exams.

According to a circular issued by Directorate of Education (DoE), each school will launch two clubs one focused on language learning, and the other on a wide range of co-curricular activities. Students can choose from Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Urdu, or Punjabi for the language club, helping them cond round of seat alloca-refine their communication skills in both classical tions, a total of 87,335 students and contemporary contexts. The second club will allow students to dive into di-

verse interest areas, such as science, mathematics, sports and yoga, visual or performing arts, inclusive education (Samarth), or leadership through a student council. This flexible approach ensures that every learner finds a space to thrive. "To support this initiative, each school will rece-

ive Rs 20,000 in funding — Rs 10,000 per club. The financial aid is intended to ensure smooth operations, resource availability, and sustained engagement across the year," said an official.

Participation in at least one club will be mandatory for all students, encouraging broad-based involvement. DoE has also emphasised the importance of detailed record-keeping and proper fund utilisation. School heads have been tasked with overseeing the programme's implementation and ensuring that objectives are met effectively.

New Delhi: In a move that will meet to some extent the demand for bungalows in Lutyens' Delhi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to inaugurate a complex with 184 large flats for MPs on Baba Kharak Singh Marg next week.

There is high demand for theseflats among the lawmakers, sources said. The new complex has four towers (25-storey each with two levels of basement) and was completed in two years. Each flat, with a carpet area of around 5,000 sq feet, has five bedrooms, offices for the MP and their PA, and two rooms for helpers. Each room has an attached toilet.

"These flats have more space than the Type-VIII bungalows which comprise the top category," said a source.

Officials said Sam India Infrastructure, which had bagged the project, has not used bricks in the structures, employing RCC and aluminium stuttering for faster construction. "While the traditional construction method allows the roof to be laid in a period of 30-35 days, through this method, it can be done every 10-12 days.



ces significantly," said an official. The Central Public Works Department (CPWD) has implemented the project at an expenditure of around Rs 550 crore. The buildings have a shelf life of

over 100 years. The two-level basement has the capacity to accommodate 500 cars. A community centre has also been built in the complex for lawmakers to hold social events. There will be four shops at the community centre to meet the requirements of MPs.

"We have also taken care of environmental considerations. Solar panels have been installed on rooftops, and we are confident of the project getting GRIHA 4starrating," said a source. A GRI-HA 4-star rating signifies that a building is "best practice environmental performer".

In recent years, the govt has created additional accommodation for MPs in the national capital. Lutyens' Delhi has around 3,000 govt-owned properties and 600 private bungalows.



New Delhi: Two burglars who allegedly broke into a wine shop by drilling a hole through its wall have been arrested in west Delhi's Patel Nagar, police said on Sunday The accused — identified as Ravi alias Ganja and Arun alias Chobha — were caught with over Rs 4.8 lakh in cash and a set of burglary tools.

The break-in occurred on the intervening night of July 30 and 31 at a licenced wine shop located along Patel Road. The shop manager discovered the theft early the next morning and alleged that unidentified individuals had forcibly entered the premises and decamped with approximately Rs 6.5 lakh in cash.

Based on the complaint, a case was registered under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) pertaining to housebreaking and theft at the Patel Nagar police station, under the jurisdiction of the Central district.

"A team was immediately formed, and officers reviewed CCTV footage from nearby areas. Two individuals were spotted moving suspiciously, with their faces partially covered," said DCP (Central) Nidhin Valsan. Following technical surve

illance, police identified the suspects as Ravi (28), a known history-sheeter from Tilak Nagar, and Arun (23), a resident of TC Camp in Rajouri Garden, previously linked to at least 16 theft and burglary cases.

Raids were conducted at the ir suspected hideouts, leading to their arrest. Police recovered Rs 4.81 lakh in cash from the duo, along with a drill machine, iron rod, and other tools allegedly used to gain entry by drilling through the shop's wall.

Ravi, who is listed as a "bad character" at the Tilak Nagar police station, had previously been externed from Delhi for two years due to his continued criminal activity. His accomplice Arun, police said, is also a seasoned offender in house theft cases.

Their arrest has helped police crack at least four pending theft and burglary cases in the Patel Nagar area, DCP Valsan added.

Both accused have been remanded in custody. Further investigation is underway to trace the remaining stolen cash and verify their involvement in other unsolved crimes.

Mandi Road Stuck Between Jams & Plans

3 Months After Delhi Govt's Proposal, No Clarity Yet On Transfer Of Key Stretch To NHAI

New Delhi: Three months after Delhi govt's plan to transfer Mandi Road to National Highways Authority of India, there is still no clarity on the status of the handover. Meanwhile frustration is growing among residents and motorists, who are urging authorities to expedite the process in light of the deteriorating traffic conditions.

Mandi Road, one of south Delhi's most heavily congested stretches, is a critical alternative route connecting Mehrauli-Gurgaon Road with Faridabad-Gurgaon Road. The corridor winds through rural settlements, upscale farmhouses and compact commercial clusters. But it is inconsistent in its width and infrastructure, making travel both inconvenient and unsafe.

As rains unleash their fury, the road is often inundated in knee-deep water. "I stood there one afternoon for nearly 20 minutes, just taking in the scene — people wading through the accumulated water, traffic at a standstill," said Juhi, a local resident. "It made me question where we were living. Even picking up children from school has become a challenge."

While the proposed right of way for the road is 30 metres, the ply between just 8m and 18m. This, combined with the absence of lane markings, street lighting, pedestrian pathways and traffic signals renders the route dangerous and inefficient. The most critical point of congestion is at the entry from MG Road, where potholes, broken surfaces and bottlenecks cause regular traffic snarls. Emergency vehicles, school buses, and daily

commuters often find themsel-

ves stuck there for long periods. The road-widening project, which requires the acquisition of 16.9 hectares of land, was first conceptualised in 2012. It was formally approved by road engineering authority Unified Traffic and Transportation Infrastructure(Planning&Engineering) Centre (UTTIPEC) in March 2023. Despite this clearance, no physical work commenced on site.

The proposed handover to NHAI comprises two segments: the Mehrauli-Gurgaon Road to the Urban Extension Road-II (UER-II) and UER-II to Faridabad-Gurgaon Road. Together, these segments form a 7.7km stretch under the broader Mandi Road corridor. According to the latest updates, despite two official reminders to NHAI, no physical handover has taken place, according to officials.

New Delhi: The Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLSA) awarded Rs 2 lakh as interim financial assistance to a 19-year-old woman who attempted suicide by ingesting acid in July after being deceived in a relationship. The money was disbursed on July 21.

The survivor was allegedly coerced into a physical relationship by a man who falsely promised marriage once she reached adulthood. When he later reneged on his commitment, the teenager, overwhelmed by the betrayal and emotional trauma, consumed acid at her residence in Vasant Kunj.

Acting on a TOI report, DSLSA stepped in and deputed a legal aid counsel, a paralegal volunteer and a counsellor to provide comprehensive support to the survivor and her family.

"DSLSA also provides free psychological counselling support at each of its district legal services authorities across court complexes in Delhi. Such services are offered by experienced counsellors on the payroll of DSLSA to the survivors of sexual offences, acid attacks and drug abuse, and even in cases of matrimonial disputes," said Rajeev Bansal, member secretary of DSLSA.

Bodies of two Nigerians found in southwest Delhi showroom

New Delhi: The bodies of two Nigerian nationals have been found on the first floor of a clothing showroom located in southwest Delhi's Dabri on Sunday.

According to police, two Nigerian nationals were found dead on the first floor of a building in Chanakya Place, Uttam Nagar. The showroom, located behind a clothing godown, was reportedly rented by an individual identified as Henry. Upon being alerted early Sunday morning, police promptly reached the location, securing the scene of the crime. An investigation team, along with experts from the forensic science laboratory, inspected the premises.

According to initial findings, there were no visible external injuries on the deceased, and no signs of foul play were observed. The bodies were identified as those of

Joshep and Chibitern, both Nigerian nationals. They were subsequently shifted to the Deen Dayal Upadhyay mortuary.

Preliminary inquiries revealed that the two were residing in the Burari area of north Delhi and travelled to Chanakya Place a day before their deaths. The purpose of their visit remains unclear and is currently under investigation, said police.

Officials said that while early signs do not suggest any criminal involvement, the case remains under close scrutiny. "We are verifying the circumstances that led to the death and gathering local intelligence. The post-mortem report will provide clearer insights," a senior police officer said.

Meanwhile, police are also reviewing CCTV footage from the area to trace the movements of the deceased and identify any suspicious activity.

Forged GST invoicing used to defraud govt

New Delhi: Crime Branch of Delhi Police has registered a case and launched a probe against a group allegedly involved in forging official documents and defrauding the govt through fake invoicing and GST evasion.

Directorate General of GST Intelligence (DGGI) conducted a probe into a syndicate suspected of orchestrating a sophisticated scheme to defraud the govt exchequer. The accused allegedly submitted forged documents and manipulated court procedures to reinstate GST registrations that had previously been cancelled.

Officials said four writ petitions were filed by individuals representing entities whose GST registrations were revoked. These petitions relied on forged show cause notices dated between Sept 2024 and Feb 2025. The falsified documents were used to cla im that cancellations lacked legal basis.

Based on these, the courts granted favourable orders. However, a review by the Central GST, Delhi, East Commissionerate, flagged discrepancies, revealing at least four such orders were obtained using forged official documents. Subsequently, the court directed the DGGI to complete a detailed investigation within one week and submit a formal complaint to the

Public outcry does not Rushing Now, Paying Later: Capital diminish gravity of the offence, HC denies bail Sees 14% Rise In Speeding Offences

New Delhi: Denying bail to a man in a POCSO case, Delhi High Court on Friday observed that mere public outcry and media coverage of the incident cannot diminish the gravity of the offence.

A single judge bench of Justice Girish Kathpalia observed that the court cannot minutely examine the evidence on record and that the broad picture showed the gruesome manner in which an eightyear-old girl was raped and killed, that too by her cousin. He said, "Merely because there was public outcry and media coverage of the incident, the gravity of the offence does not diminish.

According to the prosecution, the accused committed rape upon an eight-year-old girl, strangled her, and hid the dead body in a plastic bag in a pit.

The accused claimed th at he was falsely implicated in the case due to public pr essure and media scrutiny. He said that there was doubt regarding the time of death of the girl.

The FIR was registered in 2016 for offences under Section 302 (murder), 363 (kidnapping), and 201 (causing disappearance of evidence) of IPC, and Section 6 (aggravated penetrative sexual assault) of the POCSO Act.



Mamata slams Delhi Police for referring to Bengali as 'Bangladeshi national language'


Kolkata: West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee hit out at Delhi Police on Sunday over a notice allegedly issued to Banga Bhawan in the national capital seeking help to translate "Bangladeshi language" for an ongoing trial. The trial relates to eight suspected illegal immigrants from Bangladesh who had been arrested by Lodhi Colony police. The CM called the notice "scandalous, insulting, anti-national, unconstitutional", and called upon all sections of society to rise in protest against the repeated "insult and humiliation" of Bengali-speaking people in India.

Senior Delhi Police officers were learnt to be looking into the matter. However, there was no official comment from Delhi Police.

The notice, posted by CM on her X handle, purpotedly showed a Lodhi Colony inspector's requisition to Banga Bhavan officer-in-charge in Chanakyapuri, seeking help to translate "texts written in Bangladeshi language" in Hindi and English. "See now how Delhi Police under the direct control of the Ministry of Home, Government of India is describing Bengali as "Bangladeshi" language!" the CM wrote. "Bengali, our mother tongue, the language of Rabindranath Tagore and Swami Vivekananda, the language in which our National Anthem and the National Song (the latter by Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay) are written, the language in which crores of Indians speak and write, the language which is sanctified and recognised by the Constitution of India, is now described as a Bangladeshi language!!"

The notice uploaded by CM Banerjee refers to Lodhi Colony police station FIR no 51/2025. Case details mention eight suspected illegal Bangladeshis being arrested. According to the police, the accused did not have valid passports or visas. Banerjee said, "This insults all Bengali speaking people of India. They cannot use this kind of language which degrades and debases us all. We urge immediate strongest possible protests from all against the anti-Bengali Govt of India who are using such anti-Constitutional language to insult and humiliate the Bengalispeaking people of India."

BJP's state president Samik Bhattacharya justified Delhi Police's action and said there was a difference in the dialect of Bengali language spoken and written in West Bengal with that of Bangladesh. BJP also alleged that TMC was trying to defend illegal Bangladeshi migrants who, the party said, spoke a heavily Urdu-influenced Bengali dialect.



'Must show specific cause to inspect digital device of co-accused'

New Delhi: A Delhi court on Saturday ruled that an accused cannot seek inspection of digital devices belonging to co-accused or third parties-particularly when they contain private or unrelated data-without providing specific and justified reasons. Such requests, the court said, amount to a "fishing expedition" and risk violating the right to privacy.

Special judge Dig Vinay Singh emphasised that any requestforinspection-especially when opposed by the owners-

-must demonstrate clear, concrete relevance. "Vague or broad searches should not be permitted," the court observed.

"The irrelevant or protected content must have some value to the accused seeking inspection, and only then can a court strike a balance," the judge said, adding, "requesting inspection without a specific or justified reason, or simply hoping to find something useful, amounts to a fishing expedition. Such a broad, unfocused search without clear limits or scope amounts to a roving inquiry. It not only wastes the court's time but also risks violaamount to harassment or oppression of the device owners.'

These observations were made in connection with the Delhi Excise Policy 2021-22 corruption case. Accused Amandeep Singh Dhall had sought access to 20 mobile phones and digital devices not relied upon by the prosecution, belonging to co-accused Sameer Mahendru and Arun R Pillai, a witness, and an unrelated third party.

All four objected, citing privacy concerns. The judge, denying inspection to Dhall, observed that all Dhall wanted to undertake was nothing but a parallel investigation or roving and fishing inquiry. The court added that Dhall was seeking to build a defence that other accused persons at the relevant time did some acts of commission and omission, and then present an argument that the investigating agency, CBI, discriminated against him.

The court directed that the mobile phone and other items belonging to Pillai and Mahendru, which were not relied upon, be returned to them. The court said it seemed that Dhall was attempting to conduct a parallel investigation or inquiry to argue that the CBI did not thoroughly investigate or deliberately failed to collect all evidence, or intentionally ignored many things in others' devices.

The courts must be especially cautious when dealing with digital devices containing sensitive or private data," the judge said, adding, "When inspection could infringe upon privacy or third-party rights, it cannot be treated as an unfettered right. The accused must show specific and concrete relevance.

New Delhi: District magistrate of north Delhi has submitted a report to the NGT confirming that victims of the 2024 Narela factory fire incident have been sanctioned compensation totalling Rs 40.6 lakh. However, the kin of the deceased workers could not receive the amount due to a lack of response from the concerned officials in their home districts.

This submission followed the tribunal's review of a July 2024 TOI article titled "3 Sleeping After Shift Killed in Blaze at Narela Factory; 6 Injured." As per the submission by the DM North, four were killed and three injured in the factory fire.

For the deceased, a compensation of Rs 10 lakh each was to be given to the heirs or rightful beneficiaries, and Rs 20,000 each to the injured. Officials said they sent communication to the concerned authorities seeking details like bank accounts of legal heirs to ensure the rightful disbursement. The letters were written, as per submission, to the concerned DMs of the workers thrice on March 11, May 6 and the most recent on July 17. However, there were no responses. "Disbursement has been temporarily delayed solely because of non-receipt of verified heirship details from other jurisdictions...without which this department is constrained to process the compensation," stated the submission.

"Though sentenced to life imprisonment, he was granted six weeks parole by the Delhi High Court in 1999 and never returned. His appeal was later dismissed in 2009, and he was declared a proclaimed offender in 2014," said DCP (Crime) Sanjeev Kumar Yadav.

After narrowly escaping several raids in Kanpur due to local support, Kishore arrested in Ghaziabad.




Taxi driver charred to death in car crash The Privilege Of Impunity?

New Delhi: A taxi driver was charred to death and another critically injured after their car allegedly caught fire following a crash in northwest Delhi in the early hours of Sunday. Police claimed they were intoxicated and speeding when the incident occurred.

According to police, a PCR call was received around 2am at Narela Industrial Area police station, reporting a car accident and fire near Jhanda Chowk, close to Hulambi Khurd village. When the police team reached the spot, they found the driver's seat engulfed in flames with a man charred to death and another severely injured in the adjacent seat.

Passenger opens door of cab in Noida, biker crashes into it, dies

Ghaziabad: A 26-year-old biker died after he crashed into a cab door opened suddenly by a passenger near Golf Course metro station of Noida on Saturday morning.

Once this is over, they will go back to facelessness and a feeling of

being solitary and powerless again. It's not just the Kanwar yatris. We

have the cow vigilantes who enforce imagined blasphemies with lathis and lynchings. Student mobs who barge into libraries or disrupt lectures in the name of nationalism. Online warriors issuing rape threats wrapped in patriotic hashtags. All draw power from the same logic; the belief that the state will not interfere too soon, and when it does, it will do so gently.

And yet, it is worth remembering that the Kanwar Yatra, in its essence, is not born of aggression. At its heart lies an act of faith and physical endurance-it is a gesture of submission, not supremacy. An expression of devotion that requires discipline, sacrifice, and resolve. What has changed is not the body of the ritual, but the mood surrounding it.

Somewhere along the way, what was once an offering has turned into a claim. What was once about devotion has become about assertion. The Yatra still travels the same roads—but the journey it makes is no longer only inward.

The state seems to understand what makes this work. In a nation where resources are stretched and formal empowerment is difficult to deliver, symbolic power becomes a potent alternative. To be feared, to disrupt, to override rules without consequence—these become currencies of belonging. It is not a breakdown of order, but a redistribution of permission.

There is political genius at work here. An anger and discontent that could otherwise have taken more disruptive forms-protest, dissent, a movement for change—has instead been channelled into a mobilising force for a politically advantageous cause. A potential threat has not only been neutralised, but also converted into a prime asset. The yatris serve as a thinly veiled warning about the chaos that can be unleashed, should the need arise.

Religion has always been about identity—and this is true of all religions. But from time to time, a need is felt to demonstrate this in a visible and muscular form. We are seeing that play out in the country. Where we will reach on this path is anybody's guess.



Govt needs to pass bills but **SIR may keep Parl paralysed**

Govt Set To Stay Firm On Not **Allowing Debate**

New Delhi: As the monthlong monsoon session of Parliament enters its third week on Monday, another round of deadlock is not ruled out even as the govt has no option but to seek passage of several crucial bills, amid opposition's determined bid to carry on with its protests over the special intensive revision (SIR) of Bihar's electoral rolls.

Opposition parties have been demanding a discussion on the SIR exercise, which the govt has rejected because it cannot make a reply on behalf of the Election Commission, an independent constitutional body not represented by any department. Besides, the govt has cited a ruling of former speaker Balram Jakhar that Parliament can't discuss the administrative work of constitutional bodies like EC.

The govt is likely to remain firm on its stand and has more reasons for it as it will cite the "double voter ID" held by Bihar opposition leader, RJD's Tejashwi Yadav. Yadav had said that his name from the voters' roll had been omitted, a claim promptly rejected by EC, which disclosed the voter roll number and sought a reply from him for holding two EPIC cards.

The govt's confidence to negate the opposition's claims has further grown as the analysis of SIR figures has shown no systematic targeting of Muslims. Figures released Friday also show that migrants have not been affected and the number of deletions in constituencies where B-IP-led NDA candidates won

Bogus voters: 2 Bengal officials face FIR

Kolkata: EC approved FIRs against two electoral registration officers (EROs) in Bengal for anomalies in the voters' list, a senior poll panel official said on Sunday, reports Debashis Konar. The officers shared their passwords with data entry operators, which allowed the latter to feed 102 bogus voters' data into the EC portal.

TOI reported that EROs of Nandakumar in East Midnapore and Rajarhat-Gopalpur in North 24 Parganas were questioned by EC and were under scrutiny for failing to provide satisfactory replies. In Nandakumar, 59 people, and in Rajarhat, 43 voters — whose information needed to be verified - were entered in the rolls.

With more reasons to assert that there are no irregularities in the SIR exercise, the govt is likely to push the passage of a key sports bill in Lok Sabha. The Lower House has listed the National Sports Governance Bill, which envisages greater transparency in the functioning of sports bodies, including BCCI, for consideration and passage.

Rajya Sabha has listed for passage on Monday a resolution from home minister Amit Shah on the extension of President's Rule in Manipur by another six months with effect from Aug 13.

Except for a two-day discussion on the Pahalgam terror attack and Operation Sindoor in both the Houses, parliamentary proceedings have been all but a washout since the session began on July 21 as the SIR has ignited vociferous protests from opposition parties

INDIA bloc, which has in previous sessions often spoken in different voices, has joined ranks over the issue, alleging that EC's exercise is aimed at removing voters sympathetic to its agenda and boosting the prospects of NDA.

EC has said it will roll out the exercise nationally to "protect" the integrity of electoral rolls to ensure only eligible voters are allowed to cast votes. However, leader of opposition in LS Rahul Gandhi has accused EC of "vote chori (stealing votes)" and has been fiercely critical of the poll body. EC in a statement Saturday rejected Rahul's allegations "baseless", "unsubstantiated" and "misleading".

EC cited Section 19(b) of the Representation of the People Act, 1950, which states that everv ordinary resident in a constituency shall be entitled to be registered in the electoral roll of that constituency. 'Therefore, a person original ly belonging to Tamil Nadu but ordinarily residing in Delhi is entitled to be registered as an elector in Delhi. Similarly, a person originally from Bihar but ordinarily residing in Chennai is entitled to be registered as an elector in Chennai," EC explained. (With inputs from PTI)

Delay hits Scorpene retrofit to boost stealth, endurance

DRDO's Air Independent Propulsion System Not Ready For Integration

New Delhi: India has once again missed the boat to enhance the underwater operational endurance and stealth of its latest Scorpene or Kalvari-class conventional submarines, with the already delayed air independent propulsion (AIP) system developed by DRDO still not ready for integration with the vessels.

The first Scorpene submarine to be built at the Mazagon Docks (MDL) with French collaboration, INS Kalvari, which was commissioned in Dec 2017, will now complete her ongoing maintenance refit at the Mumbai naval dockyard without being retrofitted with the AIP plug as was originally planned, defence ministry sources told TOI.

"The fuel cell-based AIP system developed by DRDO's Naval Materials Research Lab, which has L&T as the prime industry partner, is still not yet operationally available. Hopefully, it should be ready by the time the second Scorpene (INS Khanderi) comes for her scheduled normal maintenance refit in mid-2026." a source said.

The Navy after a long delay has inducted six dieselelectric Scorpene subma $rines, constructed \, by \, MDL \, in \,$ collaboration with the French Naval Group under Project-75 for over Rs 23,000 crore, with the sixth INS Vagsheer being commissioned in Jan this year.

There is major concern about the continuing delay in the indigenous AIP project, which was originally slated for completion by June 2017 after being sanctioned in 2014 at an initial cost of Rs 270 crore.

Amid the delay, MDL and Naval Group signed an agreement for the integration of

combat capabilities. With Pakistan on course

to induct eight Yuan or Hangor-class conventional sub marines with AIP from China in a major capability jump, India's depleting conventional underwater combat arm has become a major worry. China, of course, now has the world's largest navy, which includes over 50 diesel-electric and 10 nuclear submarines.

Apart from the French-origin Scorpenes, India has seven very old Russian Kilo-class and four German HDW diesel-electric submarines at present. It also has two operational SSBNs (nuclear-powered rines armed with nuclear ballistic missiles) in INS Arihant and INS Arighaat, with the third to be commissioned as INS Aridhaman this year, as reported by **TOI** earlier.

The long-pending projects to build three additional Scorpenes for Rs 38,000 crore and six new-generation diesel-electric submarines, with both AIP and land-attack cruise missiles, for Rs 70,000 crore under Pro ject-75-India at MDL, are also yet to be finalised and inked.

Rockslide at Andhra Pradesh quarry kills 6 migrant workers

Vijayawada: Six workers from Odisha in a group of 16 excavating granite at a quarry in Andhra Pradesh's Bapatla district were killed Sunday and three others were injured when a rockslide sent a massive slab hurtling their way, giving them no time to escape, reports Madhu Rasala.

Bapatla SPTusar Dudi said rescuers were able to quickly reach those injured and move them to hospital. While four workers died at the accident site, two succumbed to injuries while being taken to Narasaraopet govt hospital.

Emergency teams needed until late afternoon to remove the debris at Satyakrishna granite quarry, near Ballikurava village, and retrieve the trapped victims' bodies.

The six who died were Danda Badatya (48), Takun Dalai (37), Banamala Chehr (30), Bhaskar Bhishoy (40), Santosh Goud (36), and Mussajan (43). The quarry owner employs a number of workers from Odisha, allegedly making them toil in hazardous conditions.

Police are probing whether safety protocols were being followed. Officials said the edge of the quarry was "weakened" by continuous excavation, leading to the fatal rockslide.

CBI nabs Customs officer after chase in Navi Mumbai

Accused Tried To Lose Bag Of Bribes During Pursuit

Mumbai: Central Bureau of Investigation arrested a superintendent of Customs following a chase inside his residential colony in Navi Mumbai during which he tried to lose a bag containing bribes.

Krishna Kumar, stationed at Sahar Air Cargo, was tailed by CBI officers after he accepted an amount of Rs10.2lakh for clearing a consignment. Kumar allegedly had a rate card for clearing cargo, said CBI. He was produced before the court and has been remanded in CBI custody until Aug 6.

CBI sources said Kumar had blocked the complainant's consignment with the help of the Rummaging and Intelligence (R&I) wing of Customs by sending a pseudonymous email about the contents of the cargo. Kumar promised to get the consignment released in exchange for a bribe, stating that most of the money would go to his seniors. CBI is investigating the roles of R&I wing officials and

On Saturday, Kumar called the complainant outside his residential colony in Kharghar and asked him to

He continuously moved his vehicle within the society premises and, during the pursuit, threw out the bag of money. The CBI officers then arrested him as he attempted to leave the society, causing commotion and disturbing other residents. CBI subsequently recovered the money. The agency said Kumar

r Akash Yadav was convicted by a sessions court abetment to suicide but was acquitted under section 304-B and Dowry Prohibition Act.

He married on May 7, 2015. His wife, who was employed at Pantnagar University, was taken to her maternal home by her brother on July 4, 2015, while Yadav was working in Hyderabad. She died by suicide on Dec 14, 2015. In her suicide note, she stated that her husband would be responsible for her death.

Yadav was arrested on May 11, 2017, and after spending more than three months in jail, he got bail on Aug 28. On Jan 21 this year, the sessions judge of Rudrapur sentenced him to five-year RI and a fine of Rs 20,000 under Section 306.

Yadav filed an interim application under section 389(1) of Code of Criminal Procedure, seeking suspension of that because of the conviction, he had become disqualified from working with IIL. His counsel argued the case met the criteria for exceptional circumstances, as the conviction had a direct impact on "work of national importance".

Justice Maithani noted that an appellate court can suspend a conviction if failure to do so would result in injustice or irreversible consequences. He cited SC rulings in Navjot Singh Sidhu vs State of Punjab (2007) and Rama Narang vs Ramesh Narang (1995) & said that courts must examine whether maintaining the conviction would unfairly affect a person's professional standing or public interest responsibilities.

The bench observed, "This was a greater issue of public health & national interest. In light of the afore-stated reasons, court was of the view that this was a fit case in which the order of conviction as well as execution of sentence, appealed against, should be suspended." HC suspended both the conviction & sentence during the appeal's pendency, allowing Yaday to resume his duties at IIL.

Mr & Mrs 55 is Dutt's rare rom-com, a witty take on post-Independence gender roles, and Baaz, his swashbuckling directorial debut. Born Vasant Kumar Shi-

vashankar Padukone in Bengaluru and raised in Kolkata before he made Mumbai his canvas, Dutt was a filmmaker who turned heartache into high cinematic art. His moody, slow-burning frames

and monologues redefined the language of Indian cinema. A pioneer of artful anguish, he made melancholy a separate genre sculpted in shadow and song with films like Pyaasa and Kaagaz Ke Phool. Off-screen too, the line

between the artist and his art often blurred. His life, famously, mirrored the aching heart in his films. Critics and fans alike continue to draw parallels between his reel and real selves, often quoting "Yeh duniva agar mil bhijaaye toh kya hai" not just for his characters but for the man himself. Dutt died in 1964, at just 39, under circumstances still described as a possible suicide.

The centenary screenings will also spotlight his family still tied to cinema. For Dutt's younger brother Devi Dutt, now 87, who produced films like Masoom and worked on Gandhi, it's a full-circle moment. "It's a dream come true to see his masterpieces restored to their former glory," he said.

Odisha paper leak: Board of secondary edu VP held

Bhubaneswar: Odisha police crime branch arrested Board of Secondary Education vice-president Nihar Mohanty Sunday for his alleged involvement in the leak of special Odisha Teachers' Eligibility Test (OTET) question paper on the eve of the July 20 exam. Subsequently, OTET was cancelled.

Earlier, the board's data entry operator Jitan Moharana was arrested on July 30 on charges of obtaining the question papers from Mohanty's laptop. Mohanty, responsible for overseeing the career progress test for in-service teachers, allegedly violated confidentiality protocols by allow-

ing Moharana unauthorised access to his laptop, police said. 'Only Mohanty had access to the password of his official laptop. After receiving the draft questions from a printer based outside Odisha for final review, he failed to delete the file from his laptop as required by protocol, indicating possible wrongful intent and criminal nexus,' said DG Vinaytosh Mishra.

An analysis of telephone records revealed unusual communication patterns between Mohanty and Moharana, including over 100 calls outside office hours in the past two to three months, Mishra added. Crime branch also noted that Moharana had previously been removed from exam duties due to concerns over his integrity and conduct.

2 awarded life term for 2022 murder of Dalit man in UP

Lucknow: A court in Uttar Pradesh's Ambedkar Nagar district has sentenced two men to life in prison for axing a 28-year-old Dalit man to death in 2022.

Special judge Ram Vilas Singh on Saturday convicted the duo under IPC sections 302 (murder) and 34 (liability in criminal act) and Section 3(2)(v) of the SC/ST (Pre-

vention of Atrocities) Act. The court also imposed a fine of Rs 20,000 each. Special public prosecutor Sudip Mishra told **TOI** the murder was committed in a village in Alapur on night of July 31, 2022.

According to the complaint lodged by one Ramvriksha. the murder unfolded after former village pradhan Ranu Tiwari visited his younger

brother Jalandhar, an electrician, to request a repair. Jalandhar agreed to do the work the following morning and left for nearby Khajhapur. Around midnight,

Ramvriksha's wife heard some noise and alerted the family. "When Ramvriksha tried calling Jalandhar, the phone was answered by an unknown person who told them to come to the fields. Upon reaching, the family found Jalandhar lying with severe in-

juries. He was rushed to the


govt hospital in Baskhari and then referred to the district hospital in Akbarpur, where he died," said Mishra.


An FIR was registered based on the complaint and the accused — Aryan alias Sachin Yadav and Lalu alias Brijesh Yadav — were arrested. Police collected testimonies, scene maps, post mortem reports, call detail records, and video evidence. A chargesheet was filed, and the case was tried in special SC/ST court.


Hearing the case, the special judge found both accused guilty beyond a reasonable doubt. "The judge concluded that the crime was intentional. caste-motivated and brutal in nature," Mishra said.

EC: No Bengal party appealed against rolls before LS polls

Kolkata: None among the eight main political parties in Bengal formally filed any objection to the final voters' list published ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, Election Commission said Sunday in a statement seeking to counter insinuations of tampering amid preparations for a special intensive revision of the rolls like the one in Bihar.

"Electoral rolls are prepared transparently; copies shared with recognised political parties," Bengal's chief electoral officer said. During the special summary revision 2024, copies of draft and final rolls were provided to all parties, the statement mentioned.

The commission said it received 34.2 lakh claims and objections between the publication of the draft and final electoral rolls. Appeals can be filed for wrongful additions and deletions, but there was no such allegation.

The statement, coming a week after the publication of based on a special intensive revision in 2002, is seen as a move to insulate the poll body from political allegations of bias as it tries to purge the rolls of illegal voters.

The poll panel indicated that even BJP, vocal on Bangladeshis and Rohingya, didn't formally appeal ahead of the Lok Sabha elections last year. EC put out a detailed annexure to emphasise its point. The annexure said all eight major political parties in Bengal, including Trinamool, BJP, Congress and CPM, received a copy of the draft electoral rolls on Nov 1, 2023.

Yogi: Slap NSA for flying drones illegally or spreading rumours

Agra: UPCM Yogi Adityanath has warned that individuals operating drones without official permission or spreading rumours and misinformation about them to create panic will be prosecuted under the Gangster Act, and in serious cases, the National Security Act (NSA) will also be invoked.

He instructed senior officials to step up district-wise drone surveillance, strengthen patrolling, and ensure all violations are dealt with firmly. The directive comes amid a series of mob attacks triggered by false claims of thieves using drones to scout homes they target in western UP. During a review meeting with

senior police officers, Yogi said that unauthorised use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) was banned in the state and any misuse would attract legal action. He added that drone misuse would not be tolerated.

"Anyone using drones illegally or for creating panic will not be spared. If required, the NSA will be used." the CM said The 'misinformation' about

drones has triggered communityled patrolling, physical assaults, and mob action against mentally disabled persons and outsiders mistaken for gang members. In some areas, residents formed vigilante groups and launched independent crackdowns based purely on unverified drone sightings.

The warning comes days after a 50-year-old mentally unstable man was lynched by a mob in Bareilly's Bhojipura area, and "outsiders" were caught and thrashed at night by locals in parts of western UP on suspicion of being "drone thieves" - people presumed to use drones

houses for burglary or arson.

Sensing public disorder, UP po lice have already launched night patrols from 11pm to 3am in some areas, along with awareness campaigns with village heads, and created a "drone register" to identify legitimate operators. Police further clarified that drone use at night has been barred completely to prevent chaos and panic.

There have also been several arrests of "drone rumour suspects" in Meerut, Muzaffarnagar, Ghaziabad and Bareilly, along with some of those involved in "mob attacks".

In the latest such case in Muzaffarnagar, three persons were held for allegedly using pigeons fitted with LED lights — in the night sky - to mimic drone activity and purportedly spread fear.

On Saturday night, a 55-yearold mentally challenged person roaming in a village in the district was targeted by locals.

Three men were later arrested. SSP Sanjay Kumar Verma said six people have been arrested in the district so far for spreading "drone thief" rumours.

hen Mahatma Gandhi called for the Quit India Movement in 1942, these young boys, Bipin Desai and Gunwant Desai, who had just finished their matriculation, jumped into the freedom movement. Together, they handed out pamphlets against the British, organised protests, and even went to jail together.

After India got independence, both went to the agricultural university in Pune. When they graduated, they came back to Surat.

From farming to running a dairy, from contract work to various businesses, they tried everything together, always as partners.

They first lived in a simple mud house in the area that has since come to be known as Chanakyapuri. Even when their families grew and needed more space, they never thought of living apart. In 1970, they built 'Maitri', a duplex with separate sections for each family but one shared drawing room that became the heart of both homes.

Today, Gautam Desai (70), Bipin's son, and Parimal Desai (63), Gunwant's son, carry forward this legacy of friendship.

'The home has seen renovations and changes over the years. but Gautam and I still live here with our families. Our sons, Hardik and Rahul, also share a won-



Will RBI cut rates? Most economists expect pause

Mumbai: Economists are split on whether RBI's monetary policy committee will continue cutting rates, but most expect it to pause at the Aug 6 meeting to assess the impact of earlier reductions.

Some economists point to softening data. Industrial production as measured by its index slowed to a 10-month low of 1.5%. Credit growth is also weaker, including a marked drop in home loans. Also supporting a rate cut is inflation running below projections.

Soumya Kanti Ghosh, group chief economist at SBI there's no use in holding off on cutting interest rates in Aug. If inflation is going to stay low and steady even in FY27, the central bank shouldn't wait. He warned that if RBI wrongly assumes that low inflation is temporary and decides not

for a long time, and the economy keeps slowing down. A cut now, he added, could support demand during the upcoming festive season. "A frontloaded rate cut in Aug could bring early Diwali... Even festive season is frontloaded in FY26... Empirical evidence suggests a strong pick-up in credit

growth whenever festive season has been early and has been preceded with a rate cut."

Others urge caution. Having already lowered the repo rate by 100 basis points (1 percentage point) over three consecutive meetings, RBI may prefer to pause, allowing the effects of previous cuts to ripple through the economy. A note by CareEdge Ratings noted that while inflation is

growth are rising, the central bank may choose to wait. It expects RBI to maintain its 6.4% growth forecast while slightly reducing its inflation outlook for FY26. The US tariff uncertainty is pushing the RBI panel toward a cautious, measured approach, most likely opting for a pause or a "dovish hold" in August while leaving the door open for future policy action.

Barclays' India chief economist Aastha Gudwani also expects the central bank to stay put in Aug. "While this backdrop is conducive for further monetary easing, we believe it is not yet compelling enough to deliver a fourth straight rate cut, and exhaust the policy arsenal," she said. Gudwani expects a "dovish pause" with RBI retaining a neutral stance and possibly delivering a final 25bps cut in Oct.

Tech me not: Consumption cos wary of IT pain hurting fragile recovery

Mumbai: Layoffs in India's IT sector is bad news for consumption. After IT giant TCS announced cutting more than 12,000 jobs, a spectre of uncertainty looms over the sector with industry body Nasscom hinting at more layoffs — this could have a bearing on discretionary consumption, squeezing demand for apparel to and electronics, say experts, as during periods of downturn, people tend to save more.



What Is An Arbitrage Fund?

Make In India

High tariffs or not, self-sufficiency in critical areas must be a national imperative

Tt is possible for a people to be self-sufficient. The Sentinelese in the Andamans, for example. But such living is extremely limiting. That's why all great nations have pursued trade, although not as a dogma in the modern way. Ancient Romans were big traders. Millennia later, Mussolini declared Italy would manage alone, only to concede as oil imports rose: "Let us not delude ourselves about autarky." As he continues lighting tariff fires well into the first year of his second term, Trump has not declared autarky or self-sufficiency as his economic goal, but his actions are tending in that direction. He wants US to make everything from chips to ships; buy little and sell a lot.

The problem with America's protectionist turn is that it affects the global order. When the largest economy, and market, raises barriers for sellers, the whole free trade edifice is at risk. India has been especially stung by Trump's tariffs. In a speech last week, Modi



flagged the resultant uncertainty and urged Indians to buy swadeshi. It does not signal India's retreat into its pre-91 walled garden, but a pragmatic pause. Globalisation may pick up pace again when Trump leaves office in Jan 2029, or as our top column today suggests, it may not as the world shifts "from

open to managed trade".

India will have to rethink strategy in that case. The ease of buying everything from computer chips to warplanes – Trump's been pushing the F-35 at India – in the 21st century can lull nations into a false sense of security. But China and America's recent actions are a wake-up call. India's a laggard in manufacturing semiconductors and fighter planes - the air force is currently depleted – and needs to catch up in the field of drones now. Then there are so many high-tech articles of civilian use that we don't make. Almost all specialised medical equipment is imported and contributes to the high cost of treatment.

So, setting up an industrial base to manufacture advanced equipment-along with a research base to develop them-should be a national priority. If low tariffs return, it will make India an export powerhouse. If they don't, we won't be vulnerable at least. In an essay he wrote in 1933, Keynes, who grew up believing in free trade, said self-sufficiency may be a worthwhile luxury for countries that want it and can afford it. "Let goods be homespun whenever it is reasonably and conveniently possible..." It's good advice.

Flying Into A Slap

When road rage becomes air rage, it's a whole lot more dangerous. Every incident must be dealt with firmly

ommercial planes commonly have a cruising altitude of 36,000 feet. Loss of temper at that height can set off domino effects unimaginable on the road or in a train. This is what flight crew have on their mind when they work to calm any passenger who loses their wits. The incident on the IndiGo Mumbai-Kolkata flight on Friday, where a passenger slapped another passenger, has to be understood in this context. What the SpiceJet crew suffered at the Srinagar airport a week ago, on the other hand, alarmingly underlines that not all passengers walk into planes in a civilised frame of mind in the first place.

With SpiceJet ground crew suffering a spinal fracture and injuries to the jaw, an army officer has been charged with "murderous assault" The

> flashpoint was his cabin baggage exceeding the set weight limit. On flights themselves, there are abundant triggers. Someone leaning their seat back into your knees, not getting the meal of your choice, someone's baby being grumpy for loud, long

stretches, being zen through it all ain't easy. But anything else could be, literally, deadly. One slap, retaliation, others jumping into the fray, it could all go out of control so easily. And a planeful of lives would be endangered. Air travel is stressful, no doubt. But that's no excuse at all for breaking the peace.

In 2023, the number of unruly passengers put on no-fly lists increased by 78% to 108. Again, this data has to be understood in the context of a very small minority of passengers being able to cause mass hurt. So, while many road rage cases go unreported, every air rage case must be filed with police. Not just the ones that cause injuries or go viral. The other thought from all this is that tolerance for lumpenism in some spaces, means it finally leaks everywhere.

How To Tackle Trump Tariffs

High US import duty will hurt, but there's much India can do to mitigate the impact. Diversifying the products basket, making small producers nimble & smartly promoting tourism will all go a long way

Thursday onwards, nearly all Indian exports to US will face a 25% tariff on top of standard US duties, plus an additional penalty. As such, India now faces one of the highest US tariff rates among Asian exporters, second only to

China (30%), and far above Vietnam (20%), Bangladesh (18%), Indonesia (19%), and Japan and S Korea (15%

With US our largest market - accounting for \$86.5bn, or 20% of India's goods $exports \, last fiscal-the \, impact \, is \, severe. \, If \,$ these high tariffs stay in place, India's exports to US could fall by 30% to \$60.6bn in the current financial year. Labourintensive sectors will be hit the hardest as shrimp exports (\$2bn) now face a 25% duty, garments and home textiles (\$8.4bn) are taxed at 34-39%, and jewellery (\$10bn) at 27.1%. Duties on metal exports (\$4.7bn) can go up to 51.7%, while engineering goods like machinery and auto parts (\$9.3bn) face over 26%. Petroleum, pharma and smartphones are currently exempt but could be targeted later.

Increasing exports to other countries to reduce losses won't be easy as the world is shifting from open to managed trade, driven by politics, security, and environmental rules. For example, EU, which bought \$75.7bn worth of Indian goods, will impose a carbon tax in Jan, hurting steel and aluminium exports. These are

already down 24.4% this year due to new reporting requirements. Indian farm products will soon face taxes under EU's deforestation law, and similar measures will likely apply to most agricultural and industrial goods. As US and EU tighten access to their markets, more countries may follow.

With global markets becoming harder to access, India's current export basket needs diversification. It's time to stop overvaluing trade policy and start prioritising product strength. China's export boom in the 1990s happened not because of trade deals, but because it offered the right product at the right price across traditional and modern sectors.

We can start by modernising traditional sectors and parallely work on high-tech sectors. For example, many handicrafts have outdated designs and century-old production methods, even as global tastes evolve. In apparel, we miss out on 70% of the world market-winterwear, fashionwear and sportswear-mainly because we make it difficult to import the input materials.

Rising input and production costs have made deep manufacturing unviable in many sectors, so we remain stuck in low-value activities like assembling imported



components. At the same time, policy choices that protect a few large players in textiles, chemicals and steel hurt thousands of MSMEs and hold back entire industries from reaching their full potential

While we look back at the 1990s as a turning point where India opened up its economy, we often ignore what China was doing then – securing lithium and cobalt mines in Chile and Congo, and investing heavily in future industries - solar, electric vehicles, electronics, toys, pharmaceuticals, apparel, machinery and chemicals. India, by contrast, didlittle and is paying the

India must change course: invest in future-ready sectors, remove barriers to input access, unleash MSMEs by reducing GST burden, and put product design and development at the heart of its export strategy. Here are three suggestions for quick results on exports and

 First, bring back the interest equalisation scheme, which was discontinued last year despite costing just ₹2,500cr annually. It offered up to 5% interest relief on

loans for export orders, helping MSMEs especially get cheaper, globally competitive finance. Reviving it with a higher annual budget of ₹15,000cr and a five-year commitment - not just shortterm renewals - will cut production costs

and give exports an immediate boost. Second, implement the UK FTA and fast-track talks with EU and other partners, keeping expectations realistic. These deals are unlikely to boost exports significantly, as average tariffs in these markets are already low-around 3-4%-and over half of Indian goods already enter duty-free. Further tariff cuts may offer only modest gains. Past FTAs show that imports from partner countries tend to rise much faster than exports, which will

Third, India must act to unlock the full potential of its tourism sector - an area where gains could far outweigh losses from declining exports to US. In 2023 India earned just \$17bn from foreign tourists, as against Spain (\$92bn), Dubai (\$31bn) and Amsterdam (\$31bn). This gap exists not for lack of heritage or attrac-

tions, but because of preventable issues: high hotel taxes harassment of foreign women near tourist sites, and taxi unions exploiting visitors under political protection. India must overhaul the tourist experience - lower costs, ensure safety, and make the country more welcoming. If we fix this, tourism could become one of India's most

They are fed up that ministers bag lucrative govt contracts and schemes for their family. Congress is mulling a law to ensure that no minister or MLA's family can snag a govt contract. Youth appreciate our focus on higher education and skilling. And industries appreciate that we're thinking of how to help value chains and supply chains, help them grow bigger. Even journalists are looking for a climate where they can ask questions without fear of retribution.

Can your agenda of development/aspirations offset deep polarisation?

That was trumped to a large extent in 2024 Lok Sabha polls when in Jorhat we could defeat BJP's communal politics and in Dhubri, AIUDF's communal politics. Differences of opinions and philosophies will always exist, but they should not lead to animosity and hate.



an words be tasted on the tongue? Can sounds be seen as coloured shapes? Such questions are not hypothetical, nor are they psychedelic hallucinations.

They refer to a well-documented neurological condition called synesthesia, in which the senses of taste, and sight, and sound, synthesise and intermingle to form a new sense or senses, which are a combination of two separate anatomical perceptions.

Medical science does not generally deem synesthesia to be an aberration needing treatment or corrective therapy, but describes it as a consistent and spontaneous neural response to external stimuli by which two senses are simultaneously evoked.

In the very rare case of lexicalgustatory synesthesia, sounds or words can stimulate the sense of taste, so that the auditory is imbued with flavour, the ear invokes the edible.

The common form of synesthesia is chromesthesia, in which sounds assume colour and can be visualised in chromatic arrangements of shapes and elaborate patterns. Far from being a disability, synesthesia

of both kinds is often associated with increased memory, creativity, and linguistic skills.

. Was Marcel Proust an undiagnosed synesthete, who wrote his seven-volume, 4215-word, monumental novel, Remembrance of Things Past, considered one of the great landmarks of world literature, inspired by the recollected taste of a made-

leine cake eaten in his childhood? None of Proust's several biographers has made such a connection, but recorded synesthetes include vastly different musicians and composers, like Duke Ellington, Franz Liszt, and Jean Sibelius; writers and poets like Vladimir Nabokov and Arthur Rimbaud; and painters such

as Vincent Van Gogh. Such creative geniuses and many

others similar to them, whom inattentive history has ignored or overlooked, have experienced the everyday commonplace world in ways that are unique. They could see sounds as colours, taste the texture of words.

What Aldous Huxley called The Doors of Perception, the title of his 1954 book, in which he narrates his experiences under the influence of mescaline, are widened when consciousness is enhanced, THE SPEAKING TREE by the use of hallucinogens

as in Huxley's case, or through mental disciplines like meditation, or by naturally occurring neurological conditions, such as synesthesia.

Could some of those singularly enabled individuals whom we refer to as mystics, or sages, or seers, people who literally see the world differently from us, be synesthetes, or be endowed with any other alternative form of sense

The Buddha is said to have attained enlightenment while sitting beneath the Bodhi tree, the fig-like fruit of which is rich in serotonin, a neurotransmitter that can alter the way we feel and think. Was the Buddha a synesthete?

Consciousness derives from the messages that nerve cells called neurons pass to each other through infinitesimally tiny points of

communication known as synapses. There are estimated to be between 86bn and 100bn neurons in a human brain. Each neuron can have hundreds or thousands of synapses, making for an assumed total of 15tn conduits of neuron messages.

The minutest of changes in this infinitely complex neurological system can lead to unimaginable differences in the way that we perceive the world.

It is this single thought of the limitlessness that lies within us that can provide all of us with a sixth sense: the sense of wonder.

VACCINES DELIVERED VIA DENTAL FLOSS

Scientists in the US have demonstrated a technique in animal models that uses ordinary dental floss to introduce vaccines through tissue between the teeth and gums. The experiment involved inoculating lab mice against influenza by cleaning their teeth with floss covered with inactive viruses. Experts who carried out the experiment said the method works by targeting the moist inner surfaces of the mouth, where the body's immune system can quickly spot and fight off invading germs. 


NEW PLASTIC THAT DISSOLVES IN DEEP SEA

particular — Lysophosphatidylserine, or LysoPS. It was barely a topic when Kamat started up his lab in 2016, but LysoPS was showing associations to autoimmune and neu-

rological disorders. "We saw patients had different levels of LysoPS than healthy individuals," Kamat said. "Problem was nobody really knew how to measure them accurately." That became the IISER lab's first big challenge. Unlike proteins or DNA, lipids are extremely hard to isolate.

It took Kamat and team two years to develop a method to detect LysoPS in blood and tissue. "We probably failed 90% of the time," Kamat said. "And we needed expensive mass spectrometers, hard to come by in most Indian labs."

Then there was the mole-

cule itself. Labs can procure molecules to work with, but LysoPS was rare in the market too. Only one US firm sold it, at an exorbitant price.

So, the IISER lab took on another Herculean task: synthesizing the molecule from

"After that, we could introduce it into animal models, into cell cultures, into their brains," Kamat said. What they found was astonishing. LysoPS was like a "biological flare gun". When tissues were injured, it helped summon immune cells to the site of damage. It regulated inflam-

mation, and then—critically—it helped shut it off. Too little LysoPS, and the immune system didn't react to threats. Too much, the body spiralled into chronic inflammation. "They have to be at optimum levels," Kamat said.

One disorder caught the IISER lab's attention: a genetic condition called PHARC (polyneuropathy, hearing loss, ataxia, retinitis pigmentosa, and cataract). Those with PHARC often get symptoms in early adulthood, from cataract, hearing loss and in severe cases brain shrinking.

"We know of at least six families in India that harbour this disease. There is currently no cure," Kamat added. His team found that muta-

tions in an enzyme, which breaks down LysoPS, were leading to dangerously high lipid levels in the brain.

"Immune cells in the brain, called microglia, went into overdrive to regulate the levels." he explained. "They started attacking neurons, just chewing them up."

After this finding, the lab

worked on mouse models of PHARC to test new therapies. One is to block the receptor that LysoPS binds to, another attempts to slow the enzyme that makes the lipid in the first place.

Both approaches are still experimental but promising, Kamat said.

His team is also working on a test to detect abnormal LysoPS levels in blood and cerebrospinal fluid, with hopes to catch the disease early — before it can cause irreversible brain damage.

Another breakthrough emerged in allergy research. The IISER lab showed LysoPS' key role in release of histamines from mast cells — the culprits behind allergic reactions.

Telangana scrambles to recover money paid to dead pensioners

Cash Kept Flowing As Families Failed To Report Deaths, Say Officials

Hyderabad: Rs 60 crore in pensions sent to the dead. Telangana's Cheyutha scheme is under scrutiny after officials discovered monthly pensions of Rs 2,016 to Rs 4,016 continued to be credited into bank accounts of 28,000 deceased pensioners for over a year. They are now scrambling to recover the money.

Officials said families of the deceased failed to report deaths, allowing money to be withdrawn — in some cases using the pensioner's debit card. "Field inspections, surveys, and data from the CDMA's NIC web portal helped us uncover the truth," said D Divya, chief executive of Society for Elimination of Rural Poverty (SERP). "In many cases, families migrated to other states. Some were deserted women with no support system.'

Jerusalem: The family of Evyatar David, an Israeli held hostage in the Gaza Strip, saw him for the first time in months on Friday evening in a video circulated by his Hamas captors. He was emaciated and sallow in what appeared to be an underground tunnel.

The video prompted an outpouring of fear and horror among the families of the dozens of Israeli hostages still held in Gaza nearly two years after the Oct 7, 2023, attack on Israel. "Our brothers are turning into skin and bones at this very moment," Einav Zangauker, whose son Matan was one of about 250 people taken hostage during the Hamas assault, said at a rally Saturday. Her son is believed to still be alive.

Over the past few days, Hamas and its ally Islamic Jihad have released three videos showing two hostages. The images of Rom Braslavski and Evyatar David have sparked strong reactions among Israelis, fuelling renewed calls to reach a truce and hostage release deal without delay. A statement from Israeli PM Netanyahu's office late Saturday said he had spoken with the families of the two hostages and "expressed profound shock over the mate-

ussia is escalating its efforts to curtail online freedom, taking new steps toward a draconian state-controlled internet.

The authorities are cracking down on workarounds that Russians have been using for access to foreign apps and banned content, including through new laws signed by President Vladimir Putin this week. Moscow has also been impeding the function of services from US tech companies, like YouTube, that Russians have used for years.

At the same time, the Kremlin is building out a domestic

and censored Russian alternatives to Western tech products. That includes a new state-sanctioned messaging service, MAX, which will come pre-installed by law on all new smartphones sold in Russia starting in September. The idea, experts say, is to migrate more Russians from an open internet dominated by the products of Western tech giants to a censored online ecosystem. where Russians primarily use software under the gaze and influence of the state. The effort advanced significantly amid wartime repression, but

Now, with the introduction of MAX, authorities have signalled they may take aim at foreign messaging apps, in particular WhatsApp, which is owned by Meta and counts nearly 100 million monthly users in Russia. Tele-

gram could be a target as well.

Anton Gorelkin, deputy head of the IT committee in Russia's lower house of parliament, said last month that WhatsApp should "prepare to leave the Russian market." Gorelkin also called Telegram "an entity that worries the state." "I am very afraid that other methods of communication are going to be blocked," said Mikhail Klimarev, head of the Internet Protection Society, an exiled Russian digital-rights group.

If WhatsApp and Telegram are blocked, Klimarev said, Russians may still gain access to them using virtual private networks, or VPNs. Though VPNs are not explicitly illegal, Moscow is expanding an effort to block them. As of late last year, Russian authorities had blocked nearly 200 VPNs, Human Rights Watch. NYT

OVAL THRILLER GOES TO THE WIRE

London: The centre square at the Oval wore a deserted look till 30 minutes before start of play on the fourth morning. Unlike the other days of this final Test of the series, there weren't players queuing up to go through their warmup drills. Yet, you could cut the tension all around with a knife. India were conserving their three strike bowlers -Mohammed Siraj, Prasidh Krishna and Akash Deep, while England's Harry Brook and Joe Root took a few throwdowns and retired to the dress-

These characters played lead roles in turning the arena into a bullring, throwing gruesome punches at each other before rain and bad light 75 minutes into the last session, took the series into its final dramatic fifth day. India will come back on Monday morning, four wickets away, with 34 runs in the bank, from finishing the series at 2-2. Brook batted like a man on steroids to score 111 off 98 while Root played the monk who had the entire field under his control as he hit 105 off 152 after they got together an hour into the first session with England, in pursuit of 374 on a tricky pitch, looking nervy at 106/3.

In 35 overs of imperious shot-making, they turned the Oval into a gladiatorial arena as England hurtled towards finishing the series just like they had started it - sauntering past a 370-plus target.

But then Siraj and Krishna were not there to agree to a surrender with figures of 3/109 and 2/95. Siraj, like Ben Stokes did in the third Test at Lord's, dug deep into his energy reserves and kept asking questions of Root's defence. That resulted in Krishna finding Root's outside edge to Dhruv Jurel to light up the match again under the dark grev London skies after Brook's hoick off Akash Deep applied the brakes on England's charge

In a spell of unchanged bowling after tea, Siraj and Krishna ensured India were still breathing following the damaging blows inflicted by Brook and Root. India will hope the duo has enough left in the tank to turn up one final time on Monday morning and prevent a 1-3 scoreline with Jamie Overton and Jamie Smith at the crease. After all, they were taking on two Yorkshiremen who were bullish about affirming that their 'Bazball' brand of cricket works

Root and Brook were advertising for the England team's 'we-will-chase-down-anything' philosophy

Siraj and Prasidh Krishna had Ben Duckett and stand-in captain Ollie Pope under their spell in the first hour of the day. They were all over England with the pitch offering exaggerated movement and some uneven bounce. Duckett edging Krishna to second slip and Pope falling to Siraj LBW seemed a matter of time. Brook wasn't having any of it; he turned up a bully.

There are moments that define the course of a big game. Siraj stepping on to the long-leg boundary when Brook, batting on 19, had topedged a short ball from Krishna was clearly one. It was reminiscent of Trent Boult stepping onto the rope after catching Ben Stokes in the 2019 World Cup final. Monday morning will tell if India end up on the wrong side like New Zealand in 2019.

It is true that Siraj was in a great rhythm deep into the morning session. He was still bowling at the peak of his powers even as it was his ninth innings of bowling extensive spells in the last two months. He was also fast exhausting his energy levels. He labored along with all his heart and passion. But his day out also highlighted that India were desperately short of another wicket-taking option. Akash Deep lacked the zip and Krishna battled hard to stay consistent with his line and length once Brook went on the rampage.

India started and finished strong on Sunday. They will hope that the day's afternoon session doesn't cost them the

committee's (NOC) inquiry committee identified the Mar 7 notification issued by then BFI president Singh as "the central issue causing delays in the election process"

Singh's March notification had stated: "Bonafide and duly elected members during the election AGM (duly notified to BFI) of the state units affiliated with the BFI shall be authorised to represent their respective states/union territories". 



New works explore realism, repression

n her latest body of work, Akansha Chaturvedi invites the viewer into a raw, unguarded realm - one that challenges comfort and dares to expose what we so often repress. This new series, recently exhibited at The Claridges, New Delhi, on August 2 and 3, holds discomfort, vulnerability, wonder, and deep thought, blending philosophical and psychological inquiry with visual metaphors and symbolism.

"Influenced by the existential grit of philosophers like Charles Bu-

kowski, the psychological insights of thinkers like Adler, and the surreal, emotionally charged canvases of great artists such as Francis Bacon, these artworks stand at the intersection of the seen and the deeply felt," says Akansha.

Through deeply personal yet universally resonant eyes, she encourages viewers to

examine the internal conflicts we tend to ignore: the tug-of-war between heart and reason, the desire to appear whole while quietly hiding longing and pain. This series continues Akansha's exploration of what lies beneath the surface. "These group exhibitions, which featured both master and emerging artists, provided the perfect backdrop for work that is as intellectually layered as it is emotionally charged," she adds.

Raanjhanaa's altered ending release is part of a growing fan trend of using AI to "fix" or reimagine

film and story endings, often driven by campaigns and algorithms detecting 'viewer dissatisfaction' - From Game Of Thrones to Barbie and more. This simply makes it official.

But a film's ending - however tragic, unresolved, or frustrating is an intentional choice, often the emotional core of the entire work. Rai's film, for all its flaws, made a narrative point: that obsessive love isn't always rewarded, that actions have consequences. Altering that message erodes the film's soul - and poses the threat of erasing the very maker's identity.

Studio Ghibli co-founder Hayao Miyazaki famously called AI creativity "an insult to life itself." He warned that automating human expression would strip art of its purpose - to connect us through emotion and imperfection. Ghibli fans have been pushing back against efforts to AI-remaster older films for "smoother" animation or altered plot beats, arguing that soul cannot be deepfaked.

India has a long history of content interference. But this is something more insidious. AI doesn't ban scenes; it replaces them. It doesn't argue; it learns what some audiences want and serves it up. The danger is that we slide into a world where all films become algorithmically optimised narratives, catering to sentiment, reducing art to comfort food. A world where *Sadma* ends with Kamal Haasan reunited with Sridevi. Where Amour ceases to explore the agony of losing your partner of over 70 years, and instead celebrates the magic of recovery!

Who, in their right cinema-watching mind, would want that?

@timesofindia.com Tith students preparing to enrol in the final year of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP), focusing on honours with research in the seventh and eighth semesters, challenges for students and teachers continue to persist. Professors are struggling to complete the additional syllabus in a limited time, making space to guide students to the research and dissertation work mandated in the fourth year. With the University of Delhi (DU) confirming 55% of average enrolment in the fourth year, confusion regarding the timely completion of research and a lack of infrastructure persists. Academics refer to FYUP as a rushed rollout without sufficient pilot data and stake-

the quality of education. The early trend of enrolment in classes that begun recently reveals that Humanities students are more likely to benefit from FYUP. In private universities, BBA, BCom, BEd and Psychology students are more inclined to opt for the fourth year to pursue careers in teaching, research or competitive exams. In Kirori Mal College, 25 out of 63 students (nearly 40%) of BA (Hons) English have opted for FYUP. However, Science students showed reluctance largely due to the absence of laboratories and infrastructure at several colleges. "Most science students interested in higher studies prefer to pur-

Rushed Rollout

The immediate concern for educators is the disorganised nature of the rollout. The real problem is ill-structured course content. Prof Chakraborty, says, "The syllabi were put together at the last minute, and there was no peer review by the experts.

qualification. The lack of sufficient infrastructure, new labs, and extra teachers in colleges have been a discouraging factor. Few Science students who have opted for FYUP are using the additional year to prepare for the competitive exams," says Prof Rudrashish Chakraborty, Kirori Mal College, DU. "Most commerce students are not finding value in the fourth year, as they are primarily interested in internships and jobs. The fourth year is not seen as adding significant value to their career goals, except for the small number of students who want to go abroad," Prof Chakraborty adds.

Poor Infrastructure

At Miranda House (DU), only around 25% students of BSc (Hons) Physics have opted for the fourth year. "Out of 80 students, only 18 are staying back; however, the number might increase to 24. It will be clearer after a week or so," says Prof Abha Dev Habib, Miranda House.

Academic Dilution

Beyond the logistical hurdles, the core academic design of the FYUP is a point of contention. There is a rising fear that the new structure compromises the deep, subjectspecific learning that was a hallmark of the previous system. Prof Chakraborty adds, "Our flagship honours courses used to be 75% core competency, which has now reduced to 50%. As a result, the students are forced to take seven papers per semester, vet their core competency is very poor because the component has be-

en compromised.' Following the NEP 2020 guidelines, Kerala rolled out FYUP from the academic year 2024-25, but faced multiple problems due to an ill-prepared curriculum and limited infrastructure. Prof Amruth G Kumar, Central University of Kerala, points out the challenge of designing relevant skill enhancement programmes and multi-disciplinary programmes. "A chemistry teacher can be trained in a pharmaceutical company to get skill-oriented knowledge, but for language teachers, we need an innovative training format," he says.

Virtual interviews increase job opportunities for tech students from tier-II and III cities

Students are securing top offers across sectors such as IT, banking, automotive, and EdTech

ndia's job market is witnessing a change as jobs are growing beyond major metro cities, with more opportunities now available in smaller cities. A report by Randstad, cited by a recent ToI report, shows that job openings in tier-II cities went up by nearly 42% between September 2024 and February 2025 — much higher than the 19% rise in bigger tier-I

cities. The re-

lighted that

high-

six major industries are driving this growth: banking and finance, manufacturing and automotive, IT, healthcare and pharma, retail, and energy. There has been a noticeable rise in the number of job offers to students from tier-II and tier-III cities, a shift that college administrators and recruiters attribute to multiple factors. The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has also played a pivotal role in ensuring that institutions in these cities are not left behind in the

The AICTE has launched several initiatives such as the National Internship Portal, AICTE Placement Portal, and National Apprenticeship Training Schemes. These platforms, with multilingual accessibility, ensure that students from smaller towns gain knowledge in their regional languages and access better opportunities. Prof TG Sitharam, chairman, AICTE, says, "The market is responding positively to these efforts. India's over 63 million Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) -

60% of which are based in tier-II and tier-III cities - along with IT, marketing, branding firms, NGOs, startups, and manufacturing companies, are increasingly recruiting from these regions." This shift has been driven by the availability of skilled youth, abundant local resources, growing engineering institutions, and government-

Soft Skills Training

Colleges have also evolved their training to meet industry demands. "Institutions are now prioritising soft skills training, which is seen to contribute to over 55%-60% placement success. Colleges that have gained autonomy have further aligned their curricula with industry needs, moving away from the outdated university-mandated syllabi," says Kapoor.

led digital skilling programmes. "As a result, salaries in certain sectors have jumped by 20%-30%, particularly for roles in software development, data analytics, cloud computing, and digital marketing," he says.

The AICTE job portal has partnered with over 2,500 companies, providing centralised access for employers to tap into talent from across India. Additionally, AICTE's internship portal has so far onboarded over 79,000 companies and registered more than 2.98 crore students, providing over 77 lakh internships across government departments and private secincluding MSMEs, NGOs, startups, and research organisations.

"Through these initiatives, AICTE is decentralising recruitment opportunities and reducing dependency on tier-I institutions. It encourages companies to recruit from a broader base of colleges by organising virtual job fairs, online placement drives, and fostering industryacademia linkages, especially in rural and remote areas," says Prof Sitharam. While major IT and con-

sulting firms such as Infosys, Wipro, IBM, Capgemini, Deloitte, Cognizant, and TCS do not physically visit campuses in smaller cities, they continue to hire in large numbers through virtual interviews. "With support from AICTE and corporate partners such as IBM, Microsoft, among others, students receive realworld exposure through internships and training programmes. These collective efforts are ensuring that students from smaller cities are not only employable but com-

A growing number of recruiters have started recognising the value of students from tier-II and III colleges. Nidhi G Kapoor, dean, Training and Placement, Kanpur Institute of Technology (KIT), says, "One of the key reasons behind this shift is the strong level of commitment and drive among students coming from these regions. Several recruiters find this drive lacking among students from tier-I cities. Technological advancements have also played a significant role; virtual interviews and online assessments have eliminated geographical barriers, making it easier for companies to recruit from campuses they would earlier overlook."

A rise in average salary packages has contributed to the positive trend. Earlier, the average package was around Rs 5 lakh per annum (LPA), which increased to around Rs 8 LPA, particularly for students in non-computer science streams. Kapoor says, "Regional recruiters from Delhi-NCR, Kanpur, and even some from Bengaluru have shown interest, particularly in colleges where students prefer staying close to home during their early careers."

MoHFW urges students to verify medical education norms in Philippines amid viral CHED notice

ollowing the recent notification floating on the internet, claiming to be from the Commission Higher Education (CHED) of the Philippines, which stated that its Doctor of Medicine (MD) programme complies with the eligibility criteria outlined by the NMC in India, under the Foreign Medical Graduate Licentiate (FMGL) Regulations, 2021, there has been noticeable interest among aspirants. The health ministry has urged the students to be watchful of the official notice before enrolling in medical colleges in the Philippines.

The ministry noticed, academic consultants are promoting the Philippines as an NMC-recognised destination to pursue medical studies, many of them refraining from giving complete information and offering false assurances regarding eligibility for FMGE or NExT exams in India. However, it is important to note that due to existing provisions under the Philippine Medical Act of 1959, the validity of CHED's notice dated July 15, 2025, remains uncertain and

does not give clarity on its eligibility in India.

Speaking to Education Times on the condition of anonymity, an official from the Union Health Ministry says, "Any student who completes their medical graduation from a country that fully complies with the FMGL Regulations. 2021, will automatically be eligible to appear for the Indian medical licensing exam. There is no need for the NMC to issue a separate notification in such cases. However, students are strongly advised to carefully review the regulatory requirements before choosing to study medicine abroad."

A notice dated July 15, 2025, came to light after a law firm, Sarmiento Delson and Dacanay Law Offices, located in Quezon City of Philippines, requested to issue a statement confirming that CHED-accredited medical schools are compliant with the Indian regulations. However, no such notice is found on the official CHED website.

A second-year MD student from Amravati, Maharashtra, studying at Emilio Aguinaldo College, Manila, Philippines, says, "There are around 500 Indian students in my university alone, and some larger universities have thousands of Indian students pursuing medical courses. After the FMGL Regulations 2021, NMC closed the doors for us to return to India as practising doctors. The only hope to make this degree useful is by clearing the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) or the Australian Medical Council exam (AMC). Considering the limited job opportunities in the United Kingdom, I am not opting for it. Even staying in the Philippines is not an option for Indians due to the 'reciprocity' provision under the Philippine Medical Act of 1959."

Under the reciprocity provision of the Philippine Medical Act of 1959, a foreigner may be allowed to practise medicine in the Philippines without passing the Physicians Licensure Examination (PLE) if the foreigner's nome count ry grants citizens of the Phi-





CAT 2025 may witness 10% uptick in applications rising to around 3.5 lakhs

s aspirants prepare to register for CAT 2025, applications open since August 1, the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIM-K), which will be conducting the exam, has already chalked out a blueprint to ensure candidates have a smooth and seamless experience. Going by past trends, the number of CAT applications is expected to rise by 10% due to wider access of online resources, the lure of brand IIM, better job prospects and an upsurge in entrepreneurial aspirations.

Speaking to Education Times, CAT 2025 convener Prof PN Ram Kumar of IIM-K that had conducted the exam in previous years, says, "Last year, we received around 3,20,000 applications, and this year, we are expecting at least a 10% increase, bringing us closer to about 3.5 lakhs.

Attributing the increase in CAT exam applications to several key factors, Prof Ram explains, "The rising demand for management education in India, coupled with the prestige and brand value of IIMs, makes an MBA an attractive career path. The promise of high-paying jobs, better career prospects, and greater professional growth are significant motivators for aspirants. "While the structure stays the same, the number of questions in each section may vary slightlv. The exam format and duration will. however, remain consistent," Prof Ram adds.

Changing Pattern

Over the years, the CAT exam has dramatically transformed from a paper-based test to a computer-based format, with significant changes in duration, number of questions, and sectional distribution over the years. The 2020







CBSE introduces II-tier curriculum for Social Science to increase application-based learning

fter the successful implementation of the II-tier system for Maths and Science in class IX and X, the CBSE introduced a similar curriculum model for Social Science (SST) in class X. The pilot project was launched in July in selected schools across India. Under this system, there will be two separate sections-Advanced and Basic Social Science, based on the difficulty levels. This forward-looking reform, currently being tested in Kendriya Vidyalayas, government, and private schools, seeks to personalise learning, reduce dependence on coaching, and enhance continuity between secondary and senior secondary education.

Tailored Approach

Sudha Acharya, principal, ITL Public School and former chairperson, NPSC, whose school is part of the CBSE pilot, emphasised the value of student choice in the new system. "The new dual curriculum is designed to align with students' career aspirations. For instance, students aiming for engineering or medical entrance exams such as JEE or NEET can opt for Advanced Math and Science, while those considering law or civil services or are planning for CLAT or UPSC may prefer Advanced Social Science and Basic Science. This flexibility allows students to focus on their goals and make informed sub-

ject choices," she says. The advanced curriculum serves as a bridge to senior secondary education by integrating chapters aligned with class XI and XII content. This initiative aims to ease the often-abrupt transition students experience between secondary and senior secondary levels. "Chapters that were earlier removed from the secondary syllabus such as the periodic table in Organic Chemistry have gradually been reintroduced in the advanced curriculum of class X. This is aimed at deepening students' understanding early on so that they do not struggle in classes XI and XII, where it has been observed that students who perform well in class X often face difficulties with the class XI syllabus," says Acharya.

morising the content is no longer sufficient; the ability to apply knowledge in unfamiliar contexts defines competence," she adds.

Teachers are being trained to teach the new formats and understand the new assessment standards. "The teachers are undergoing training in competency-based assessment, with institutions such as Azim Premji University offering speciali-

sed courses in question paper design," she says.

The feedback from the pilot project will play a crucial role in shaping CBSE's future curriculum for classes X and XII. As the initiative progresses, the NCERT is actively developing textbooks aligned with the new two-level curriculum. These resources are expected to be ready in time for the planned rollout of the revised higher se-

condary curriculum. While the two-level curriculum model marks a progressive shift in school education, its success will depend largely on how thoughtfully it is implemented across India's diverse schooling landscape. Highlighting the challenges, Praneet Mungali, trustee, educationist, Sanskriti Group of Schothe need for robust teacher training to handle differentiated content, fair and well-designed assessments that do not imply hierarchy, and ensuring resource equity so that rural or under-resourced schools are not left behind. Addressing social perception is equally important, as students opting for the Basic level must not feel inferior."
